Grand Priory of Argentina: Food and clothing were sent to the interior of the country in areas affected by the floods and also to the Province of Santiago de Estero. Winter clothing was sent for the children of Primary School N ° 877 of the town "San Ignacio de El Soberbio", province of Misiones.





Grand Priory of Austria: Members volunteer for the PHAN-TASTENMUSEUM at the Palais Palffy in recognition of the Vienna Fantastic Art. Since March 2018, members gave donated food to street people twice a week.

Grand Priory of Belgium: Donated clothes for poor people in the region of Antwerp, Belgium. Donation to Hachiko, an organisation who trains assistance dogs for disabled persons. Ute our Templar dog came to us for training then started her education in a foster home.






Grand Priory of Croatia: Members from two units organised a fundraising for the benefit of children with chronic health problems and helped the elderly by donating firewood and offering comfort.

Grand Priory of Finland: Financially supported Finnish war veterans, Red Cross, soldier's grave project and youth work in addition to support to the Evangelical Lutheran church of Jerusalem and Holy Land.





Grand Priory of France: Financial contributions to the reception and accommodation of homeless people. Also participates in a wide distribution of food. Funded a water sanitation program jointly with the Commandery of the Philippines. Made contributions to Oikocredit.

Grand Priory of Germany: Supported the "Integration Center Nieheim – Markus Academy", a Training Center for Christian refugees of the Education Institution of the Coptic Church in Germany; financial support of child, youth and elderly projects.





Grand Priory of Greece: Donations of clothing to refugees, food to the Church of Greece, heating oil to the Foundation of children with special needs and financial support to the elderly in Athens.

Grand Priory of Ukraine: Assisted upgrade of facilities of the Pereiaslav-Khmelnytskyi orphanage. Provided kitchen equipment and teaching aids. Donated computers and a refrigerator. Visited children on religious and national festivals, donating clothes and hygiene products.





Grand Priory of the United Kingdom: The Grand Priory, and their two arms-length charities, had a busy year with donations made to worthy causes and individuals, supporting pilgrimages and education of Christians at home and in the Holy Land.
